Mid – Term Beckons



Child Protection/ Health and Safety

Punctuality As you know it is important that the children develop good time-keeping habits from an early age. Please ensure that the children come to school on time each day.

Absences Parents / Guardians are reminded that there is a legal obligation on the Principal to record every absence of every child throughout the school year, with an added obligation of reporting absences of over 20 days to the Educational Welfare Board.

Updating Records: Please inform the school if there has been any change in contact details or other circumstances. It is important that the school has a second contact number in case of an emergency.

Notes Parents/guardians are asked to write a note of explanation in the pupil's homework journal following an absence and give it to the class teacher. A phone call or email to the school will also suffice. The class rolla is called no later than 9.45am each morning. Pupils who arrive after said time are marked absent. Your cooperation with these procedures is greatly appreciated.

Medical Issues: It is imperative that the school has up to date knowledge of any medical issues your child may have. You were asked to provide details of medical issues on your child's enrolment form but over time these details may have changed e.g. allergies etc. Please feel free to contact the school by phone or email at any time with any extra information you would like us to know about your child. All information will be treated sensitively and discreetly. If your child has Asthma, we ask that your child keeps the emergency inhaler in their school bag at all times and that the class teacher is informed of the child's illness and the location of the medication and how to use it when necessary.

Following notification to all parents, requesting new nominations for a mother parent nominee and father parent nominee, consent forms for parent nominees were sent home last week. Two parents offered to take up the roles. As they are unopposed they are deemed to be elected to the Board of Management. We are delighted to welcome Dan Smyth and Aileen O Leary back to the BOM. The teacher nominee is MS Jessica Sherwood. Over the next few weeks, two further people will join the Board. These will be community nominees selected by the board. We look forward to working together.

Collecting and dropping Children to and from school

If you are dropping your child later than 9.00 a.m. or after the bell has rung and the children are off the yard, please escort your child to one of the school entrance doors. **It is a parent's responsibility to ensure their child enters the school before they leave.**



Supervision

Our early morning extra supervision, commencing at 8:30am, has been very much welcomed by parents. I am very thankful to all the staff who have supported this measure to support parents. Children will remain on the yard with a supervising teacher and SNA unless it is raining. If it is raining, they can enter the school and wait in the corridors.

School opens at 9.00am and closes at 2:40pm. The BOM cannot take responsibility for supervision of pupils before 8.30. am or after 2:50pm. The school would greatly appreciate your support in this matter. No responsibility is accepted for pupils arriving before that time. Classes will commence each day at 9.00am.

Classes will end each day at 1.40pm for Junior and Senior Infants and 2:40pm for all other classes. The school cannot accept responsibility for looking after children after that time. Please make sure to bring a coat and hat to school every day


Parent- Teacher Meetings

School Rules

School Uniform

We are always very proud of how the children present themselves every day in full and correct uniform. We acknowledge your support and commitment in presenting them so neatly. Black shoes or all black runners may be worn with the school uniform. On PE days any colour runner may be worn. P.E. days are usually Thursdays and Fridays. When purchasing replacement tracksuits and tops please make sure they are plain navy. The Fries GAA top is also acceptable if it is blue/navy/white only. This prevents unnecessary pressure on parents to buy expensive labels. On P.E. days the children wear their runners to school at present. Please make sure all tops, lunch bottles, boxes, tin whistles etc. are labelled.



Football and Hurling.



September saw us get straight back into our football and hurling training with Vince Cooper and Colm O Brien. The Cumann na mBunscol football competition kicked off for the senior room in mid- September. We travelled to Spa GAA pitch for the blitz stage of the competition in which we scored highest in the 2-3 teacher category to progress onto the quarter final. On Friday 13th October, we played Scoil Naomh Eirc from Feothanach. A riveting game of football ended with Knockaderry scoring 2-6 to Feothanach's 2-4. This win allowed us to move onto the semi – final against Ballylongford N.S. We played this game on October 19th in St. Senans GAA pitch. After a stellar performance from Knockaderry, unfortunately luck was not on our side. In Sports, we know that these losses are just as important as winning and we look forward to giving it our best shot again next September. The hurling Cumann na mBunscol will take place later in the year.

Patrick O'Keeffe Festival Musicians Visit

On Tuesday October 17th the school took part in the Patrick O'Keeffe Traditional Music Festivals Sliabh Luachra Outreach Programme. This involved three renowned musicians, Derek Hickey (formerly of Dé Dannan) Eoin Stan O'Sullivan and Niamh O'Brien, visiting the school. They brought their accordion, fiddle and harp with them and played the music of Sliabh Luachra for the students of Knockaderry. They also gave the pupils the history of Patrick O'Keeffe, explaining the renown that he is still held in and why a festival takes place in Castleisland in his honour. The children played two polkas, 'The Rattlin Bog' and 'Maggie in The Woods' and the whole school sang 'Péigin Litir Mór' as the musicians joined in. This was a truly rewarding cultural experience for our students.



Maths week 2023

Maths week took place from 16th to the 20th October. Pupils carried out a range of mathematical activities with their classes. Maths Week is an important way to help learners, of all ages, enjoy maths and to highlight the creativity of the subject. We always encourage parents to look for opportunities to talk about maths in the environment such as money, time, shapes, angles, etc. The more a child is exposed to math language and day to day math problems, the more they are able to apply knowledge they learn in the classroom to the outside world. Classes completed 'Math's week Quizzes', completed maths riddles, worked on connecting maths to our everyday environment and played lots of fun maths games.



Friendship week 2023

We recently celebrated Friendship Week. Every year we focus on the theme to encourage children to value the friends they make and learn how best to foster these relationships. Throughout the week, each class explored the theme of friendship through discussions, stories, art, and music. Each child contributed to the school's friendship tree by designing their own unique handprint showing the qualities of a good friend! As we learn how to be good friends, we can also recognise when others are being unkind. We want our pupils to be on the lookout for ways we can improve each other's lives, by inclusion, by being kind, by spotting when somebody might not be feeling themselves. It might be an idea to speak to your child about friends they have and how they are getting on. Children can find friendship relationships changing as they grow and it is great to be able to open up and chat to someone if this is happening.
